



Howe Caverns and the National Baseball Hall of Fame

October 9-10, 2010

Day 1: Depart Willow Street from Executive Coach. Traveling to New York, after a fast food lunch (on your own), we will head first to Howe Caverns. You will be whisked by elevator 156 feet below into a cavern 6 million years in the making. You'll journey past the River Styx, The Sentinels', Titan's Temple and The Giant Formation to the shores of the Lake of Venus.



From there, your boat will launch you down river to the edge of darkness. On your return trip you will navigate the 500 foot serpentine passage known as the winding way, one of the world's best examples of underground water erosion. Following the cavern tour we will depart to check into the Holiday Inn. Then you will enjoy a hearty buffet at the Big Brook's House of Bar-B-Q (included). A legendary restaurant that prepares its feasts on the largest indoor charcoal barbecue pit (38 feet in length)

Day 2: After enjoying breakfast at the hotel (included), we depart for Cooperstown where you will have the entire day to explore the town at your leisure. You will be dropped off at the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum (admission included). This is one of the country's most popular destinations and is surely the best-known sports shrine in the world. It is every fan's "Field of Dreams" with its stories, legends and magic to be passed on from generation to generation. Once you are finished exploring the museum at your leisure. You may want to consider eating at a local restaurant, riding the trolley, shopping, a visiting local art galleries, taking a self guided walking tour of Cooperstown, catching a game at



Doubleday field, visit the wax museum or take a trip on the Glimmerglass Queen Tour Boat.

Accessibility

To fully participate in this tour may require extended periods of walking, standing and sitting. Participants with physical limitations should take this into account.

The National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum is in compliance with all of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) regulations.

Howe Caverns- Wheeled devices and strollers are not permitted in the cavern. Above ground areas are accessible to mobility impaired visitors. A 25 minute video of the cavern tour is available for those who cannot tour the cave. The cavern tour consists of a 12 city block walk with a 15 minute boat ride half way through the tour. Anyone who has breathing problems or difficulty walking and negotiating stair steps should take note.
